God is moving the people out of Egypt and towards His promise. Yes - Exodus is brimming with hope!

Like Moses and the Israelites, we are all on a journey of discipleship with the Lord. In all, we see the God who over and over makes a way where there is no way.... so that we can "go forward!" (Exodus 14:15)

So then, let's lean in with eagerness over the next 6 months for what the Lord has for us in Exodus!

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How to Utilize this Series Guide

Our Series Guides through books of the Bible are designed to 1) encourage you to get in God's Word on your own, 2) build your ability/confidence to study & understand God's Word on your own, 3) enable you to assemble all your notes in one place for synthesizing and future access, and 4) help you ultimately apply God's Word within the community of the church.

At The Well, we streamline our preaching and Gospel Communities to sync up together with your personal bible reading so that these 3 elements are merging in your life for strong, gospel saturation. Rather than being scattered in many directions, we believe this intentional singular direction enables real depth in your discipleship so that, over time, you actually grow!

Here's how these 3 are meant to be fused together in this guide:

#1 - Personal Study: Observation - Each week this is your time to read and study that week's passage on your own before it is preached. The goal is not mastery with every insight gained and every question answered, but rather discovery as you explore the truth found in these verses. There's no exact mechanical system to it, as reading the Bible is much more about relationship with God - we want to draw near to behold Him and enjoy Him! So then, listen to Him - the author - as He reveals His Word to you. While preaching and community will come in for parts 2 and 3 to help ensure proper interpretation and good, gospel application, this 1st phase is simply about diligently engaging the Bible as best you can. We are not after mere knowledge, but after knowing God Himself! Therefore, eagerness, curiosity, and a humble, prayerful heart that's looking to learn is key. The weekly template is designed to help you navigate basic tools as you read, investigate and attempt to understand what God is saying. Feel freedom to pursue whatever sticks out to you, stumps you, or leads you to more of Jesus!

#2 - Sunday Sermon: Interpretation - As we gather on Sundays to worship together, we're meant to hear God's Word preached to us from pastors God has placed to shepherd the church (1 Pet. 5:1-4, 1 Tim. 4:13, 5:17, 2 Tim. 4:2). While anyone can comprehend the meaning of Scripture directly and personally, we see throughout the Bible spiritual leaders as a gift of God's grace to teach His people - helping them understand it by 'giving the sense' of the Word as Nehemiah 8 describes it. Amidst the swirling sea of interpretations out there, and even amidst the many directions people can take within a single local church, pastoral preaching is meant to provide a stable, authoritative interpretation to guide the church. So, as you hear the passage preached to you on Sunday, use this space to take notes as you actively listen and process all you've been studying.

#3 - Gospel Community: Application - The final phase comes as we meet together in our Gospel Communities to further apply the passage we've studied and heard preached into our lives. It's a time for responding to the Word at a heart level and practical level. And, what better context for that than within community - where God designed us to live out our Christian lives! Not only does this sharpen our understanding and application as we learn from each other, but it gives us people to

encourage us to actually walk it out in real, tangible ways. Loving God and loving others was never meant to happen in isolation - in fact, it can't! From putting sin to death to growing in the fruit of the Spirit, from processing suffering to celebrating joys, from learning big theology to walking out the one-anothers or living missionally to the lost - life change happens in community.

* Each of these are not exclusively separate compartments but naturally have overlap. So, don't feel confined in your personal study as if you can't consider how God might be encouraging you to apply something, or in GC as if you can't dig into a point of interpretation to better understand the meaning together. While the 3 stages of personal study, Sunday sermon, and Gospel Community provide a progressive flow, there will be organic overlap throughout.

Introduction | Book Background & Context

It's important to understand the context of what we read in the Bible so that we can rightly understand it as it was originally written. Parachuting into a new book requires that we first learn the lay of the land we're entering. The answers to these questions sometimes come directly from the book itself (see Exodus 1), but usually can be found in the bottom notes or even in the front of the book in a good Study Bible. If your bible doesn't have this, we recommend getting one (ESV Study Bible is a great option).

When was Exodus written?

In what style was this book written? (Poetry, narrative, prophecy, letter, etc.)

Where does it take place?

Who is the intended audience?

2 - Hone in on **Luke 24:25-27** and **24:44-45** - What is Jesus saying about Himself and the Old Testament?

3 - Go back through weeks 1-15 and answer - where do you see Jesus in Exodus? How is He foreshadowed and pointed to? What things does Jesus fulfill?

4 - Which event in Exodus foreshadows the cross? Which event foreshadows the resurrection?

5 - What effect were these events meant to have on the Israelite people? Similarly, what effect is Jesus' death & resurrection meant to have on us as His followers? How are they similar and how are they different?

6 - In God's story we find our story. Thus far in Exodus, how do you see your story connecting with the Israelites and God's rescue of them out of Egypt? What ways can you personally relate in your own journey of discipleship? Is there a certain place along the way that you feel you are at or that has specifically has spoken to you?

7 - From the previous question - now bring Jesus into the picture. How does knowing the fuller story of Jesus' redemption & resurrection (and future return) give you hope where you're at right now?

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


